General Points

• Students are not permitted to leave the Academy premises during lunchtime.

- The Academy uses a cashless catering system; wherever possible students should be registered with a biometric algorithm of their thumbprint. Should the Academy not receive consent to do this a pin will be issued which students must remember and use whenever they wish to purchase food. Parents must set up a "Parentpay" account and ensure that there are sufficient funds available to cover the cost of student's lunches/snacks. This can be done online or by using a "Paypoint" card at local stores. Paypoint cards cost £1.50 and must be requested from the Academy. If you have not received an activation letter or require a Paypoint card please contact Mrs Mahoney at the Academy via e-mail amahoney@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk or on 01621 787839.
- When students leave the Academy the balance on their Parentpay account can either be refunded or transferred to a younger sibling at the Academy. The minimum refund amount is £5.00, smaller amounts will be transferred to the school fund.
- Your child may be able to get free school meals if you receive any of the following:
 - Income Support or income-based Jobseekers Allowance
 - Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
 - Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
 - The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
 - Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more that £16,190)
 - Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
 - Universal credit.

Students using any of the ORA food outlets should:

- Queue in an orderly fashion.
- Return trays to the collection point before eating.

Attendance

As a school we will expect and require full attendance and punctuality to registration (am/pm) and to all lessons.

School commences at 8.45 a.m. each day when morning registration will be taken. Lesson by lesson registration is taken throughout the day.

Lateness

Students arriving after 8.50am are late and are required to sign in with staff on the Late Gate or at Student Reception.

If you know your child is going to be late, where possible please phone the office on 01621 787880 Students who are persistently arriving late without a valid reason will have a sanction imposed in the form of a school detention.

Illness

If your child is going to be absent through illness please send a text in via the "MyEd" App, call the attendance line on 0845 355 8104 or call the office on 01621 787880 by 8.30am on each day of absence. A message must be received for every day of absence.

Your message should include the following:

- Student's full name
- Mentor Group
- Reason for absence
- Name and contact telephone number of the person leaving the message

If no contact is made you will be sent an absence message via text.

Any unexplained absences are unauthorised and will be recorded as such on the student's record.

Medical Appointments

If you know in advance that your child will be late for school or absent due to a medical appointment please send a letter to Student Reception and we will require proof of any appointments if it is within the school day. Early notification of absence/lateness will help avoid receiving unnecessary absence notifications from school.

Authorised Absences

As from 1st September 2013, due to statutory changes in the Education Regulations 2006 Section 7, Headteachers may no longer grant any leave of absence during term time. This instruction replaces the prior arrangement where an allowance of 10 days holiday per academic year could be applied for in advance. Leave of absence will only be considered under 'very exceptional circumstances' and family holidays do not come under this criterion. Any holidays taken will be classed as unauthorised absence. The Local Authority may then issue a penalty notice with a fine of £60 per child, per parent/person with parental responsibility, being levied. Failure to pay this fine could result in the Local Authority arranging a court hearing.

Attendance Interventions

Currently the level of attendance required by the academy is **97%** and above. Anyone that falls below the threshold of 90% will be considered a persistent absentee and risks being referred to the **Missing Education and Child Employment Service**. Mrs Penberthy our Attendance Officer will contact home with any concerns around your child's attendance.

Our students are regularly rewarded for maintaining excellent attendance.

Ofsted ranked our attendance as 'Good' at the last inspection so as a school we expect **97%** or above attendance for all our students and will invite parents of students falling below this to school based meetings to discuss how improvements can be made.

Academy Uniform and Clothing Policy

Every student is expected to wear the academy uniform with pride and respect. Our students will be the leaders of tomorrow and it is important that they understand what it means to present oneself professionally.

Trousers are to be plain black school trousers. Leggings are not permitted at all, whether worn as trousers or under the academy kilt, neither are jeans. Decorative belts, combat style trousers and cropped trousers are not permitted.

Only the official Academy jumper is permitted, sweatshirts and hoodies are not to be worn.

The items below can be purchased from any supplier.

Footwear must be plain black school shoes. Trainers, of any kind, are not permitted neither are canvas shoes e.g. Vans, Converse, plimsolls. Boots, platforms, sandals, sling backs and fashion shoes are not allowed. Kickers are permitted but must be black with black stitching and black laces. Shoes should not have heels over 2cm.

Coats, scarves, hats and gloves are not to be worn in school. Sweatshirts or 'Hoodies' of any description **do not** qualify as 'coats' and may not be worn.

Bags

Bags should be large enough to carry the required equipment for learning, including an A4 folder.

Hair

A student's haircut is a very important part of their presentation. The Academy will not accept students having extreme haircuts; hair should be no less than grade 1 all over. Students are not permitted to have extreme hair colours. Any colour change must be natural in appearance. Shoulder length hair should be tied back for all practical lessons. The school reserves the right to enforce sanctions on students with extreme hairstyles in accordance with the behaviour policy.

Leggings

Please note that black leggings of other brands can be worn for PE; however, they must be worn under/in addition to ORA PE shorts or an ORA skort. If your child opts to wear ORA leggings, they may be worn without shorts or a skort.

Make up

Students can wear minimal, natural make up. False eyelashes are not permitted.

Nail Varnish & False Nails

Students can wear natural nail polish and nails. Nails must be short and suitable for PE and technical subjects.

Jewellery

Students may wear a wristwatch and one pair of stud earrings (one in each ear).

No other form of facial or body piercing is permitted.

Any student intending to have piercing done must do so at the start of the summer holidays.

Any inappropriate jewellery will be confiscated and placed in the school safe. However, the Academy cannot accept responsibility for the safekeeping of jewellery or any item which is not permitted as part of the uniform policy and therefore any items which are brought into the Academy are at your own risk.

Lost Property

With a large number of students in the school, a vast amount of lost property is generated. All items should be clearly marked with a permanent marker or name label. Please do not bring in valuable items or large sums of money. If you do need to, for any reason, please take it to student reception to be held in safekeeping until the end of the Academy day. The Academy does not accept responsibility for loss of valuables.

Overall identity

The Academy uniform has been designed to reflect the high aspiration we have for our students. It is clearly identifiable within the local community and beyond; students should wear it in an exemplary manner at all times including whilst travelling to and from the Academy to represent us with pride.

Our uniform policy requires the support of parents. The 'contract' between the Academy and parents makes it clear that parents are obliged to provide the required uniform as set out above. Parents are also responsible for supporting the Academy in enforcing the correct uniform and standards. All students are required to wear specified Academy PE uniform for all PE and Sports. This must be purchased from the official Academy suppliers or via the Academy shop.
