• Create your own musical board board game based on The Orchestra. There are some facts below to help you. Or if you have access to the internet, here are some cool websites to help you.



What is an orchestra?





An orchestra is a large instrumental ensemble. A typical orchestra is made up of four sections

- > Strings Violin, viola, cello, double bass, harp
- Brass Horn, trumpet, trombone, tuba
- Woodwind flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon
- Percussion instruments Timpani, xylophone, cymbals, piano
- Orchestra's have grown over the years.
- Did you know that an orchestra could have up to 100 players playing together at the same time!
- A conductor is the leader of an orchestra One of the main roles of a conductor is to help keep everyone in time with each other by using hand gestures.
