Aspire:

Students are offered extensive extra curricular opportunities, exposing them to a rich and progressive experience, as they are able to explore the world of theatre and develop a sense of cultural capital through our trips and workshops.

Be Independent:

Through drama, they develop substantial transferable skills such as independent working, cooperation and collaboration with others.
