We wish you all an enjoyable weekend and look forward to seeing students again on Monday.




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Literacy

This was a fantastic opportunity for our students to explore how STEM has a key role to play in the environment, sustainability, and engineering careers. They spent the day visiting exhibits from companies such as Rolls Royce, National Grid, RAF, BBC, Amazon, and so many more. There was quite a focus on coding this year with FUZE offering the students the chance to learn how to code their own game on a Nintendo Switch, and Robocode showing students how to get robots to play hide and seek. The students really made the most of the opportunity and were so polite and engaged when speaking to the volunteers around the exhibition. It was a pleasure to take them on the trip and we really hope they came away feeling inspired about careers in STEM!
