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Environmental Group - Mrs Mahoney

Last week members of the environmental group visited Green Recycling in Maldon. They wanted to find out what actually happens to our waste, how it is processed and how we can improve recycling at the school. Students asked a lot of questions and found the machinery used fascinating.

"The machines were really good and there were not many people working there", Tegan (7SMO)

"It was really interesting to find out that all of our rubbish is recycled", Emme (7CGA) 100% of waste collected from the school is recycled in one way or another, being distributed to various processing centres dependent on the type of waste. This means that nothing goes to landfill. Green Recycling were the first company in the UK to move to robotic processing at the plant and continue to lead on effective recycling.

"I found it really interesting that our cardboard goes to a factory in Kent and is recycled into new Amazon boxes", Pippa (7SMO)

> "I liked the pigeons that live there, but it was a bit stinky!", Archie (7CTH)

One point we did note was the fact that the conveyor belts cannot pick up black bags as they are also black. Green Recycling kindly donated some boxes of clear bags so that we can move across to these and improve our recycling strategy, making the task easier at the plant.

Recycling and waste reduction are one of the topics on our ECO schools action plan; we are currently working on the renewal of our Green Flag award and are working towards improving our status to distinction during the Summer.

All students were given some "goodies" to take away, including a wheelie bin pencil sharpener (see photo).





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OAT Competition

OAT Eco Trust and Estates are looking to run a long-term project for the next academic year.

The focus is for schools to try to reduce the amount of waste they generate and send to landfill. This is the right thing to do for the environment but can also result in savings.

OAT needs posters to promote this across the trust, in schools and offices. The deadline for submission is Wednesday 12th July.

Students can submit any poster that supports the aim of this project. The poster can focus on one type of waste reduction or could include all the types we are aiming to reduce.

Poster Guidelines

- Please keep them to A4 size
- Put your name and class name on the back of the poster, so they are away from the design.
- Please do not put your academy name or logo on the design.
- Please avoid using metallic effect pens/ink/paint, as this doesn't scan well, and we don't want to be changing your design!
- You can create a computer graphic, draw or photograph anything you want to do with recycling/reuse waste, as long as it is in colour and is your own work.
- You can use crayons, charcoal, felt tips, paints or computer designs but please don't stick anything on it.

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Sixth Form Induction Day





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
