

Message from the Principal

I hope that you have all had a good week.

Our OAT Education Director, Nicola Bull visited us on Tuesday to review the impact that our Disruption Free Learning policy has been having. I am really pleased to report that the feedback she was given by both students and staff was that the policy continues to have a really positive effect on teaching and



learning in the classroom. Your continued support given to our students to uphold the 3 Rs of the academy's Code of Conduct: Be Ready to Learn, Be Respectful and Be Responsible is really appreciated and is really making a difference to improving student behaviour.

I would like to now turn our attention to punctuality to school and lessons. Although the vast majority of students are arriving on time there is a minority that are missing out on learning time. I would like to be able to share this information with you in Go 4 Schools in order that you can support our staff to ensure that children are on time to school and class. I am asking our data team to prepare this information ready to share on a daily, 24 hours delayed, basis. We are aiming for a launch on Monday 18th March. More information will follow next week. Please can you start laying the foundation for this work by having conversations with our children about the importance of punctuality to school, class and in preparation for life after school and work.

To celebrate National Careers Week our careers lead, Ms Compton, organised our annual Careers' Fair on Thursday. I would like to thank all the external providers and local businesses who gave up their time to support this event and provide invaluable information and advice to our students.

On Wednesday a group of Year 9 students were invited to attend a cookery school day at Braxted Park Estate as part of their Cook up Your Maths, Amplify your Talent Programme.

We also had our Year 8 Parents' Evening and, as always, it was great to see so many parents and carers in attendance to support our students' educational progress.


Tea with the Principal

Ski Trip to Zell am See, Austria

Over the half term break, 46 students from Year 11 and Year 13, along with 7 members of staff embarked on our first ski trip for many years to Zell am See in Austria.

After departing on Friday afternoon, we were treated to a quiet ferry crossing and empty roads for most of our journey.

Despite losing a couple of hours around Munich, we made it to our hotel on Saturday afternoon before unpacking and heading straight to ski hire to collect our boots, skis,



helmets and poles. For the next four and a half days, our students skied on the Kitzsteinhorn in Kaprun. The glacier (over 3000m above sea level) meant we had lots of snow and, with the neighbouring resorts struggling for snow on the lower slopes, we were in the best place for our lessons.

The students were treated to all conditions: blue skies, cloud and even fresh snow. Without many knowing it, they navigated so many obstacles and necessary changes in technique and confidence in order to tackle the changing climate.

Our days were long, but with a hot lunch in a mountain restaurant and a chocolate bar in their pocket, all students dealt with the physical demands well. We also enjoyed some après ski activities such as a pizza night, a trip to Zell am Centre and our favourite - the Alpine Coaster in Kaprun!

Our journey back over Thursday night and Friday morning was a huge success. Thanks to clear roads and a coach of sleeping students, the drivers made an earlier crossing which meant we were back in Burnham for Friday lunch time. I understand many of the students had the best nights sleep that night and I thank them for their efforts over the week. My overriding hope is that they appreciated the opportunity afforded to them by generous parents and that one day, they might head out to the mountains again with a group of friends to continue their joy of skiing.

Our next trip will be in February of 2025 when we are heading to the Milky Way area of Sestriere-Sauze D'Oulx in Italy.

Finally, thank you to the parents for providing this opportunity, our wonderful staff for their tireless efforts over the week, and of course, our students. Our rep said we were the best group she had ever had!

Parentpay

The daily limit for students to spend is set at £4.50 as a default. This means, should a student select items at break and / or lunch which take them over the limit, they will be asked to put something back. If you would like to change the limit on your child's account please email our catering manager lwarner@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk. Please note: it can take a while before the cashless system updates once you have added funds to your child's catering account. Please be mindful of this and try and get the money on there in plenty of time for break / lunch. When adding funds please ensure you add it to Dinner money and make sure it's not just sitting in your parent account.

Free School Meals

The daily limit for free school meals is £3.30. Funds will need to be added to your child's Parentpay account should you wish them to be allowed to exceed the limit.

Catering Cards

Students must tap their catering card each time they wish to make a purchase, even if they are entitled to free school meals. Please remind them that they need to bring their catering card in every day. Those students without their card will be held back until the end of the queue, allowing those through with cards first. The cards really speed up the catering service, giving students more time to socialise with friends and eat their food. If a card is lost or damaged, a new one can be purchased for £1 on ParentPay. The new card will be delivered to tutors the following morning.

We can only accept cash for shop purchases on site, we are unable to use credit on a students catering card. Alternatively, you can complete an order form and return it to finance@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk.

Year 10 & 11 -You will find an item on ParentPay - KS4 Revision Guides & Equipment- just overwrite the amount with the total to be paid, we will check it against your order and let you know when the items can be collected from the shop (or you can call in and collect from main reception if you would prefer).

Year 7, 8 & 9 (KS3) - Once we have received your completed order, we will add it to your ParentPay account. When payment has been confirmed we will let you know when the items can be collected from the shop (or you can call in and collect from main reception if you would prefer).
