

Message from the Principal

We reach the end of another busy week at Rivers. As we move into exam season, I would like to wish all of our Year 11 and Year 13 students the best of luck in their exams over the coming weeks and assure them that we are all on hand to give them any support they need.

On Monday six students travelled to Theydon Bois Golf Club to compete and represent Rivers in the Essex Team Golf Championship and for the first time in Rivers history, the Year 11 Boys Football team played in the District Finals against Great Baddow High School at Melbourne Park in Chelmsford. Congratulations to all our students who represented the academy in these competitions!

This week, five of our Year 9 students were invited onto the next stage of the Essex Boys & Girls Club 'Life Skills Course'; a week residential trip taking place at High Row, Carrock Fell in the Lake District.

We are continuing to focus on improving both attendance and punctuality to school and lessons. The student punctuality module on Go4Schools is now up and running and your child's timetable will now display lesson by lesson attendance including late, absent and illness marks displayed daily on a 24 hour delayed basis as well as showing individual subject attendance, a weekly breakdown and average daily trends for your child's attendance. Please can we ask parents to use this information to support and encourage your children to arrive at school and to their lessons on time.

Please can I also ask you to support our students to maintain the academy's uniform expectations, in particular skirt length (skirts should not be rolled up) and the shoes your child is wearing to school:

- Black school shoes: Shoes must be plain black leather with no white or coloured logos or stitching. We do not allow suede shoes, boots, slingbacks, wedges or trainers like 'Nike Air Max'. However, we do allow all black Nike Air Force 1s, Converse, All Stars, Puma and similar but again, they must be all black leather.
- Academy Blazer with blue trim and Ormiston Rivers Academy Badge this must be worn to and from lessons.
- Plain black school trousers or Academy tartan mock kilt. Skirts should not be rolled up and the length should be below mid-thigh.
- Black socks or black or neutral plain tights.
- White school shirt that can be done up to the top button (long or short sleeves).
- School tie to be worn at all times.
- Hoodies and non-school jumpers are not permitted.
- Leggings are not permitted at all, whether worn as trousers or under the academy kilt, neither are jeans or chinos.

I wish you all a restful weekend and look forward to seeing our students back at the academy on Monday.



Parentpay

The daily limit for students to spend is set at £4.50 as a default. This means, should a student select items at break and / or lunch which take them over the limit, they will be asked to put something back. If you would like to change the limit on your child's account please email our catering manager lwarner@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk. Please note: it can take a while before the cashless system updates once you have added funds to your child's catering account. Please be mindful of this and try and get the money on there in plenty of time for break / lunch. When adding funds please ensure you add it to Dinner money and make sure it's not just sitting in your parent account.

Free School Meals

The daily limit for free school meals is £3.30. Funds will need to be added to your child's Parentpay account should you wish them to be allowed to exceed the limit.

Catering Cards

Students must tap their catering card each time they wish to make a purchase, even if they are entitled to free school meals. Please remind them that they need to bring their catering card in every day. Those students without their card will be held back until the end of the queue, allowing those through with cards first. The cards really speed up the catering service, giving students more time to socialise with friends and eat their food. If a card is lost or damaged, a new one can be purchased for £1 on ParentPay. The new card will be delivered to tutors the following morning.

We can only accept cash for shop purchases on site, we are unable to use credit on a students catering card. Alternatively, you can complete an order form and return it to finance@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk.

Year 10 & 11 -You will find an item on ParentPay - KS4 Revision Guides & Equipment-just overwrite the amount with the total to be paid, we will check it against your order and let you know when the items can be collected from the shop (or you can call in and collect from main reception if you would prefer).

Year 7, 8 & 9 (KS3) - Once we have received your completed order, we will add it to your ParentPay account. When payment has been confirmed we will let you know when the items can be collected from the shop (or you can call in and collect from main reception if you would prefer).
