

#### Message from the Principal

It has been a quieter week at the academy now that our Year 11 and Year 13 students have commenced study leave. These students continue to sit their exams; we continue to wish them luck and to assure them that all our staff are here to support them in the final push towards the end of the exam season.

As we continually strive to raise the standard of behaviour in the school, we are adding a further level of sanction to reinforce our expectations that students should:

- Be punctual to class and school
- Complete work to an appropriate standard
- Be fully equipped to participate in every lesson

We are introducing short break and lunchtime detentions led by departments which will still allow students to obtain food and have a comfort break but will also support our expectations. All detentions will be logged on Go for Schools. Detentions will commence on Monday 17th June.

Over the next few weeks, we will be planning further improvements to our behaviour for learning systems and will be sending out a consultation document in order that you can share your views on how our systems may be developed.

On Thursday, our sports leaders from Year 10 and Year 12 provided an opportunity for students from our local primary schools to practice a range of events in preparation for the Dengie Sports competition which is taking place on 3rd July. Approximately 200 students rotated around long jump, high jump, tennis ball throw, relay, sprints and hurdles. Many thanks to our PE department for organising this and to the students who helped on the day.






One of the literacy challenges we run weekly is "Word of the Week" where students are invited to use the word in a sentence and submit it in order to receive merit points.



#### Year 9 – Ms Taylor

This week, Year 9 are continuing to work on study skills, and this week they have been focusing on the forgetting curve. Mentors have been discussing with students the importance of revisiting the key concepts of lessons - ideally the same day for a first review - and this will be vital in Key Stage 4.

We forget most of what we learn if we do not review it, and review it briefly, and often whilst the information is new. With a simple question of "What have you learned today?" rather than "How was your day?", parents and carers can support with improving memory and kickstarting REAL revision, which when done well is short and constant, rather than relearning which is trawling through already forgotten material for an imminent exam. The image below shows how quickly learning is lost if not reviewed and this is one value of homework.



Congratulations to the Year 9s who completed their Bronze Duke Of Edinburgh Award expedition last weekend. I heard wonderful reports about their conduct and I am so proud of them, and hope they recognise what an achievement this is.

Mentors are focusing on attendance in order to support the year group in becoming resilient learners. 90% attendance equates to  $\frac{1}{2}$  a day learning missed per week, and this will inevitably lead to lower grades if not rectified. I am grateful for the collegiate way in which both students and parents/carers are working with me and mentors to raise aspirations in the year group.

Well done to all and a big thank you to the parents and carers for supporting them to practice and prepare for this at home, it is much appreciated.
















#### Year 12 & 13 - Mrs Wilkins

#### **Nut Allergies**

Any form of nut or products that contain nuts should not be brought into school. We do have students with severe nut allergies, which can be life threatening, and we would appreciate your support in keeping them safe.

#### Parentpay

The daily limit for students to spend is set at £4.50 as a default. This means, should a student select items at break and / or lunch which take them over the limit, they will be asked to put something back. If you would like to change the limit on your child's account please email our catering manager lwarner@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk. Please note: it can take a while before the cashless system updates once you have added funds to your child's catering account. Please be mindful of this and try and get the money on there in plenty of time for break / lunch. When adding funds please ensure you add it to Dinner money and make sure it's not just sitting in your parent account.

#### Free School Meals

The daily limit for free school meals is £3.30. Funds will need to be added to your child's Parentpay account should you wish them to be allowed to exceed the limit.

#### **Catering Cards**

Students must tap their catering card each time they wish to make a purchase, even if they are entitled to free school meals. Please remind them that they need to bring their catering card in every day. Those students without their card will be held back until the end of the queue, allowing those through with cards first. The cards really speed up the catering service, giving students more time to socialise with friends and eat their food. If a card is lost or damaged, a new one can be purchased for £1 on ParentPay. The new card will be delivered to tutors the following morning.

We can only accept cash for shop purchases on site, we are unable to use credit on a students catering card. Alternatively, you can complete an order form and return it to finance@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk.

Year 10 & 11 -You will find an item on ParentPay - KS4 Revision Guides & Equipment- just overwrite the amount with the total to be paid, we will check it against your order and let you know when the items can be collected from the shop (or you can call in and collect from main reception if you would prefer).

Year 7, 8 & 9 (KS3) - Once we have received your completed order, we will add it to your ParentPay account. When payment has been confirmed we will let you know when the items can be collected from the shop (or you can call in and collect from main reception if you would prefer).


#### Change of Personal Details
