

Message from the Principal

It has been another productive week at Rivers.

On Tuesday we had a follow up visit from Richard Dolding, our OAT Education Director who continues to report an ongoing improvement in standards of both uniform and student behaviour.

We are currently focusing on improving attendance to school and I would like to share with you the



statistics below which show the impact that attendance has on our student's GCSE outcomes. To support with this Rivers students who have 100% attendance will be rewarded each week with merit points and an entry into a termly draw for a £50 Just eat voucher. Parent/Carer support in ensuring that your child attends school when possible and arrives to school on time is invaluable.

While an attendance figure of 90% may not sound very low, research in 2016 showed it reduces a child's chance of achieving 5+ 5-9 grades at GCSE from 81% to around 57%.

Even for high-achieving students poor attendance has a significant negative impact on their grades. It has been shown that missing just **17 days** of school in Year 11 reduces final GCSE grades by **one level across all subjects**.

It has been a busy week for our PE department with a Year 8 boys away football game at Sandon School on Tuesday and an Under 16 girls home football match and a Year 7 & 8 girls home netball match against Moulsham and a Year 10 Boys home football match against Boswells taking place at the academy on Wednesday.

On Wednesday, some of our A Level Dance students were taken to the Linbury Theater at The Royal Opera House in London to see 'The Mad Hatters Tea Party'. This show is an energetic remix of Lewis Carroll's Wonderland by hip hop company ZooNation.

I wish you all a restful weekend and look forward to seeing our students on their return on Monday.

Update on Behaviour & Culture

We have seen a positive start to the year with over 220,000 positive points awarded to students for effort, progress in their learning, positive contributions or community actions.

Occasionally some students do not meet our CARE values and expectations and will be awarded a department detention. These are issued for lateness to lesson, inadequate work, lack of equipment or relocation from lesson. Students are notified of their detention on Go4Schools and informed of the time and location of their 10 minute break or lunch detention in the morning by their tutor.

If students make the decision not to attend a department detention this is then escalated to a Head of Department detention which is a 30 minute break detention and you will be informed by Go4Schools notification and by a MyEd message.

Failure to attend a Head of Department detention will result in a 1 hour after school SLT detention communicated by Go4Schools and a phone call from the pastoral team.

Please can we ask for your support. Conversations at home to discuss their behaviour and to support them in attending are important in helping students take responsibility for their actions and understand the need to deal with consequences before they escalate.

Helping parents to understand the changes to fines for term time holidays

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued for unauthorised holidays recorded by schools after 19th August 2024.

Who may be fined?

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent who allows their child to be absent from school.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent who allowed the holiday receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for an unauthorised term time holiday the fine amount will be:

£80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Increasing to £160 if paid between days 22-28.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.

These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence, including the U code (late after registers have closed).

For example: a 5 day holiday would meet the national threshold.

The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

Second Offence

(within 3 years)

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

£160 per parent (who allowed the holiday), per child, payable within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)


The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and local authorities will need to consider other available measures to address the absence concerns. This may mean that cases are presented before a Magistrate's Court. Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.

Cases found guilty in the Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

Unveiling the Scientific Method

In groups, students designed their own experiments using the steps of the scientific method from hypothesis to conclusion. Ideas flowed, theories were debated, and by the end of the session, three exciting experiments were ready to be tested.


Year 12 & 13 - Mrs Wilkins

Nut Allergies

Any form of nut or products that contain nuts should not be brought into school. We do have students with severe nut allergies, which can be life threatening, and we would appreciate your support in keeping them safe.

Parentpay

The daily limit for students to spend is set at £4.50 as a default. This means, should a student select items at break and / or lunch which take them over the limit, they will be asked to put something back. If you would like to change the limit on your child's account please email our catering manager lwarner@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk. Please note: it can take a while before the cashless system updates once you have added funds to your child's catering account. Please be mindful of this and try and get the money on there in plenty of time for break / lunch. When adding funds please ensure you add it to Dinner money and make sure it's not just sitting in your parent account.

Free School Meals

The daily limit for free school meals is ± 3.30 . Funds will need to be added to your child's Parentpay account should you wish them to be allowed to exceed the limit.

Catering Cards

Students must tap their catering card each time they wish to make a purchase, even if they are entitled to free school meals. Please remind them that they need to bring their catering card in every day. Those students without their card will be held back until the end of the queue, allowing those through with cards first. The cards really speed up the catering service, giving students more time to socialise with friends and eat their food. If a card is lost or damaged, a new one can be purchased for £1 on ParentPay. The new card will be delivered to tutors the following morning.
