


Message from the Principal

We have had another busy and active week at the academy with lots of prospective parents joining our open morning tours for future new Year 7 students. I would like to remind you that the deadline for applying for a secondary school (Year 7) place for September 2025 is 31st October 2024, via the Local Authority admissions page at: <u>Secondary school places | Essex County Council</u>.



Thank you to all our parents/carers who gave your views regarding our access to mobile phones in school consultation. We had some really positive and helpful feedback and will update you on the next steps after half term.

As you are aware we have been implementing a new detention system to support our Behaviour for Learning policy. A 10-minute department breaktime/lunchtime detention will be set for the following reasons:

- Any student that is late to lesson (after the 5 minute transfer time but not over 10 minutes later as this is truancy)
- Students without equipment/kit, students who do not complete an appropriate amount of work during the lesson
- Students that are relocated during a lesson.

If a student fails to attend the department detention or refuses department relocation or truants a lesson, they will be set a Head of Department detention. This detention is for a whole break time. Students will be allowed to eat and drink in this detention but must bring their own food/drink from home for this purpose. Parents will be sent a message notifying them the day before if their child has a Head of Department detention.

We have also introduced after school detention on Mondays and Thursdays. This detention is for one hour after school. Late buses are in place to support this. Students will be placed in after school detention if they fail to attend a Head of Department detention, or as part of a sanction for a serious incident or repeated relocations/truancies. You will be notified by your child's Head of Year the day before if they have an SLT detention.

Students will be notified if they have a detention on Go4Schools and should be told by their Form Tutor each morning in mentor time if they need to attend a detention at either break or lunchtime that day. However, to ensure attendance to detentions can we please ask that parents/carers regularly check your child's Go4Schools and remind them if they have any detentions that they need to attend.

Please also note that Head of Department detentions do not take place every day so your child may be given one several days after non-attendance at a departmental detention or for a serious incident or repeated relocations/truancies. We ask you to please bear with us while this detention system becomes embedded.



On Tuesday next week we have our Rivers Sixth Form Open Evening starting at 5pm and I look forward to seeing lots of prospective sixth form students and parents visiting the academy to understand and appreciate the wide variety of post-16 options we have on offer in Rivers Sixth Form.

I wish you all a restful weekend and look forward to seeing our students on their return on Monday.





Club News

Experiments in Action!

This week's Science Club meeting was all about execution! After last week's exciting planning session, our young scientists rolled up their sleeves and brought their experiments to life. The room was buzzing with excitement as hypotheses were put to the test, and results began to take shape.

Here's what went down:

The Great Cookie Dunk Experiment: Three different brands of cookies were dunked in milk to see which one could survive the longest without crumbling. If you guessed that the chocolate-coated cookie would hold up the longest, congratulations! You're right. The chocolate acted as a

protective shield, keeping the cookie together even after an extended milk bath. Can you spot the cookie that lasted the longest?

Paper Towel Absorbency Challenge: Next up was the showdown between three paper towel brands. Our budding scientists measured how much water each brand could soak up, and the results were fascinating! One towel absorbed more than 70% of the water, proving itself to be the most absorbent by far. Which brand do you think came out on top?

The Parachute Drop: Our final experiment, the parachute design, hit a small bump in the road. As any good scientist knows, research doesn't always go according to plan! The parachutes didn't quite descend as expected, so we'll need a little more time and some design tweaks before we get conclusive results. Stay tuned for next week's exciting follow-up!

Remember, science isn't just in the classroom, it's everywhere! We'll meet again next Wednesday at 3:20 p.m. in room S08. Until then, keep questioning, keep experimenting, and stay curious!


Knitting and Crochet Club

Nut Allergies

Any form of nut or products that contain nuts should not be brought into school. We do have students with severe nut allergies, which can be life threatening, and we would appreciate your support in keeping them safe.

Parentpay

The daily limit for students to spend is set at £4.50 as a default. This means, should a student select items at break and / or lunch which take them over the limit, they will be asked to put something back. If you would like to change the limit on your child's account please email our catering manager lwarner@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk. Please note: it can take a while before the cashless system updates once you have added funds to your child's catering account. Please be mindful of this and try and get the money on there in plenty of time for break / lunch. When adding funds please ensure you add it to Dinner money and make sure it's not just sitting in your parent account.

Free School Meals

The daily limit for free school meals is ± 3.30 . Funds will need to be added to your child's Parentpay account should you wish them to be allowed to exceed the limit.

Catering Cards

Students must tap their catering card each time they wish to make a purchase, even if they are entitled to free school meals. Please remind them that they need to bring their catering card in every day. Those students without their card will be held back until the end of the queue, allowing those through with cards first. The cards really speed up the catering service, giving students more time to socialise with friends and eat their food. If a card is lost or damaged, a new one can be purchased for £1 on ParentPay. The new card will be delivered to tutors the following morning.

We can only accept cash for shop purchases on site, we are unable to use credit on a students catering card. Alternatively, you can complete an order form and return it to finance@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk.

Year 10 & 11 -You will find an item on ParentPay - KS4 Revision Guides & Equipment- just overwrite the amount with the total to be paid, we will check it against your order and let you know when the items can be collected from the shop (or you can call in and collect from main reception if you would prefer).

Year 7, 8 & 9 (KS3) - Once we have received your completed order, we will add it to your ParentPay account. When payment has been confirmed we will let you know when the items can be collected from the shop (or you can call in and collect from main reception if you would prefer).

Helping parents to understand the changes to fines for term time holidays

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued for unauthorised holidays recorded by schools after 19th August 2024.

Who may be fined?

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent who allows their child to be absent from school.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent who allowed the holiday receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for an unauthorised term time holiday the fine amount will be:

£80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Increasing to £160 if paid between days 22-28.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.

These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence, including the U code (late after registers have closed).

For example: a 5 day holiday would meet the national threshold.

The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

Second Offence

(within 3 years)


The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

£160 per parent (who allowed the holiday), per child, payable within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and local authorities will need to consider other available measures to address the absence concerns. This may mean that cases are presented before a Magistrate's Court. Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.

Cases found guilty in the Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.
