## Re: Proposed Change from Separate Science to Combined Science

I am writing to inform you about a proposed change to your child's Science pathway following their most recent mock examination results and the wider challenges to the Year 11 timetable. We are proposing that your child moves from Separate Science to Combined Science. We recognise that this decision may come as a surprise, but we believe it is in your child's best interest.

This change would take effect from **January**, when we return from the holiday break. This timing ensures that we can make the most of the remaining time and provide your child with the fullest opportunity to prepare effectively for their exams.

This proposal has been made to ensure your child is best positioned to achieve their full potential. By moving to Combined Science:

- Your child will continue to have **six Science lessons per week**, maintaining substantial curriculum coverage and allowing more time to focus on mastering key concepts.
- The length of their exams will reduce from **1 hour 45 minutes** to **1 hour 15 minutes**, helping to alleviate some of the pressures associated with longer assessments.
- There will be around **30% less content** to learn, enabling your child to focus on developing a greater depth of understanding of the core material. This also allows time to be directed towards other important subjects, such as English and Mathematics.

These adjustments are designed to provide a more manageable workload while increasing your child's ability to perform confidently and successfully in their exams.
