
Tea with the Principal



We've had a shortened but productive week back. There are just a couple of classes that we are still waiting for their tests to be completed but all the results and data will be on Go4Schools within the next couple of weeks.

This week has also seen the introduction of more starter activities using white boards which I feel the students have engaged with well.

Year 7 have been looking at spreadsheets using Microsoft Excel which allows the students to practice using formulas in much the same way as they would using a programming language, and while there isn't an exam that explicitly uses this software, I'm sure that most parent carers would agree that spreadsheet skills are useful to learn for a multitude of jobs in the real world.

Year 8 have been starting work with the CPU with some impressive efforts from Ava and James in 8R/Cs1. They used the 'little Man Computer' to write Assembly Language Code and see the relationship between the CPU and RAM.

Year 9 have now all handed in their graphic design projects and will be graded on this over the next week or two. They have now started learning about Boolean Logic which links in nicely with the GCSE curriculum. BBC Bitesize has some nice resources for Boolean Logic for those that would like to do some research at home.

Year 10 have been revising for their forthcoming test and a special 'well done' to Hazel who has successfully completed all of the Python Challenges.

Year 11 have taken their Component 1 & 2 PPE mock exams and the school will be releasing the results in due course.

We are delighted to invite you as parents to download our Safer Schools App provided by our school insurance provider Zurich Municipal for free.

About the App:

The App is designed to support and protect children by educating and empowering you with the Information you need to help keep them safe online. You will receive alerts regarding identified online dangers so that you are well informed and can act if necessary. If you are worried about securing your child`s device, have a question regarding online laws, need to report an incident, want to find out if the app they use is safe? - the App will be able to help you with all of that. As adults we are also vulnerable online - there is a comprehensive knowledge base to help you keep you safe too.

Your child will be encouraged to install a child version of the app- They do not enter any details (no emails etc) due to GDPR only a PIN.

Excited? Ready to make your children safer? Download the Safer Schools App now! Make sure to enable push notifications to keep up-to-date with our tips, advice and guidance on how to keep your children safe.

Please Note: Only email and passwords are needed for adults

Step 1 – The App is free to download from the Apple App Store or Google Play Store. Simply search Safer Schools England.

Follow the Table of Contents on the right-hand side to go directly to the sections you need. As an adult user, you'll need to start by creating an account. We do not require the children to do this due to GDPR compliance. Your account is used to allow you to utilise the features with the App.

Step 2 - You'll now be prompted for an email address and password. If this is your first time, select Create An Account in the box un the box u

Step 3 - Once filled, tap Register. You'll then see a terms and conditions pop-up. You'll need to scroll down to highlight the Agree button. Once it's highlighted, you can tap Agree. If you do not scroll down, you will not be able to continue. Once this has been agreed to, your new account has been created and you'll be directed to the Add School Or Role page.

These are the details you will use whenever you need to log in to the Mobile App or the Web App.

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Step 4 - Next we need to add your role or roles. This corresponds to your role within the school community. All content is age and role appropriate, so as a parent you may see slightly different features or content or have different capabilities than your child's school staff or your child themselves.

Each role has its own 4-Digit PIN Number or QR Entry Code. Once you've logged in, you'll be prompted to **Add School**. These codes can only be obtained from your school Admin Account holders. Once you have the relevant one, Enter the 4-Digit PIN Number (after searching for your school) or **Scan the QR Entry Code** (there is no need to search for your school if using this option). You will then immediately be logged in to the corresponding role, and this will be saved to your account.

The Scan QR code option will open an in-App camera to scan it with. This is the one that must be used otherwise it will not work.

How do I use my codes?

The **4-Digit PIN Number** or the **QR Entry Codes** are provided by the school and are unique to every school.

Logging in with a PIN Code

If using a **PIN Code** to log in, you'll need to search the school name first. Once you see it pop up in the list, select it and click Continue. Then you'll see a screen with 4 spaces. Enter your unique 4-Digit PIN Number here, and tap Enter Code.

Logging in with a QR entry code

If using a QR Entry Code, you won't need to search the school's name. Just tap the Scan QR **Code** option and this will open a camera in-App for you to scan it with. Once you do, this will log you in/add the correct school and role to your account immediately.

We have pleasure of enclosing a link to next weeks <u>menu</u>. Please note that items are subject to change at short notice due to availability of produce from our suppliers. We welcome feedback on our catering offer; so please email our catering manager, Leanne Warner at <u>lwarner@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk</u> with any comments / suggestions.

Nut Allergies

Any form of nut or products that contain nuts should not be brought into school. We do have students with severe nut allergies, which can be life threatening, and we would appreciate your support in keeping them safe.

Parentpay

The daily limit for students to spend is set at £4.50 as a default. This means, should a student select items at break and / or lunch which take them over the limit, they will be asked to put something back. If you would like to change the limit on your child's account please email our catering manager lwarner@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk. Please note: it can take a while before the cashless system updates once you have added funds to your child's catering account. Please be mindful of this and try and get the money on there in plenty of time for break / lunch. When adding funds please ensure you add it to Dinner money and make sure it's not just sitting in your parent account.

Free School Meals

The daily limit for free school meals is £3.30. Funds will need to be added to your child's Parentpay account should you wish them to be allowed to exceed the limit.

Catering Cards

Students must tap their catering card each time they wish to make a purchase, even if they are entitled to free school meals. Please remind them that they need to bring their catering card in every day. Those students without their card will be held back until the end of the queue, allowing those through with cards first. The cards really speed up the catering service, giving students more time to socialise with friends and eat their food. If a card is lost or damaged, a new one can be purchased for £1 on ParentPay. The new card will be delivered to tutors the following morning.

Helping parents to understand the changes to fines for term time holidays

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued for unauthorised holidays recorded by schools after 19th August 2024.

Who may be fined?

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent who allows their child to be absent from school.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent who allowed the holiday receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for an unauthorised term time holiday the fine amount will be:

£80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Increasing to £160 if paid between days 22-28.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.

These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence, including the U code (late after registers have closed).

For example: a 5 day holiday would meet the national threshold.

The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

Second Offence

(within 3 years)

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

£160 per parent (who allowed the holiday), per child, payable within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and local authorities will need to consider other available measures to address the absence concerns. This may mean that cases are presented before a Magistrate's Court.

Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.

Cases found guilty in the Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.




