




Year 7 Girls Futsal

Year 7 have been continuing their learning journey with Spreadsheets, and this week the focus was using Microsoft Excel to calculate and format real life scenarios. The students commented to me that their parents used spreadsheets for similar tasks during their work life so it was nice to see that the students are appreciating the usefulness spreadsheet software.

Year 8 have been learning about embedded systems which is a current hot topic. Embedded systems are aften part of the IoT (Internet of Things) where pieces of hardware that are embedded with sensors, software, and other technologies are used for the purpose of connecting and exchanging data with other devices and systems over the internet. This is currently one of the most popular courses at university and the students seem to like it. Well done to Teddy and Ella of 80/CS2 that did particularly well with these tasks.

Year 9 have been consolidating their learning of logic gates by applying their knowledge to real life scenarios such as controlling the temperature of a greenhouse automatically. Students are encouraged to practice their logic circuits using the 'Logic.ly' website. Ben, Evie and Thomas of 90/CS3 particularly well with these tasks, well done!

Year 10 have been busy going through their recent test results and used a rating of green, amber or red depending on how well they did with each question. Students were then encouraged to perform various growth tasks relating to the areas of knowledge that require the most attention. A special well done to Alex, Cooper, Hazel and Suzie who got the highest marks.

As I move into my final weeks being Head of Year 9, my focus remains on creating a safe and engaging space for students. Creating this space is about fostering kindness, respect and inclusivity. To be transparent, I have needed to address this more than ever with students this week and I need your support with reminding our children about the importance of treating others with respect. It is something that I say every single morning to them on our daily line up, whilst form tutors do the same during PSHE and Culture Wednesday.

I was genuinely moved by the new Netflix series 'Adolescence' and would encourage parents/carers to watch it if they can. It isn't an easy watch and in truth, Jamie's story isn't far -fetched. We are living in a world where children are regularly exposed to toxic social media, indoctrinated by what they consume. Every single day, I see the effects that social media is having on our children. The series highlights the rise of incel culture, with communication using emojis with negative meaning and hidden messages. Reducing your child's time on social media is challenging, but it's possible with a combination of clear boundaries, engaging alternatives, and open communication. Here are some effective strategies:

Set Clear Limits

- · Use screen time controls or parental controls to set daily limits on social media use.
- · Establish "no-phone zones" (e.g., during meals, in the bedroom at night).

Lead by Example

- · Model healthy screen habits by limiting your own social media use.
- Prioritise in-person interactions over screen time.

Encourage Offline Activities

- · Get your child involved in hobbies, sports, or creative activities.
- · Plan family outings or game nights to replace screen time with quality bonding.



Use Apps & Tools

- · Apps like Apple Screen Time, Google Family Link, which can help monitor and limit usage.
- · Set up 'Find my Friends' to ensure you are aware of your child's location.

Educate About the Impact

- · Discuss the effects of excessive social media use, including mental health concerns.
- Encourage self-awareness by having them track their screen time.

Make it a Collaborative Effort

- · Instead of enforcing strict rules, involve your child in setting reasonable limits.
- Help them recognise when social media is interfering with sleep, school, or real-life relationships.

- · Stay calm & open-minded Avoid confrontation, as that may deepen their resistance.
- · Encourage critical thinking Ask open-ended questions that make them reflect.
- Expose them to diverse perspectives Introduce books, discussions, and experiences that broaden their worldview.
- **Strengthen emotional connection** Maintain a trusting relationship so they feel safe discussing their beliefs.

We have pleasure of enclosing a link to next weeks <u>menu</u>. Please note that items are subject to change at short notice due to availability of produce from our suppliers. We welcome feedback on our catering offer; so please email our catering manager, Leanne Warner at <u>lwarner@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk</u> with any comments / suggestions.

Nut Allergies

Any form of nut or products that contain nuts should not be brought into school. We do have students with severe nut allergies, which can be life threatening, and we would appreciate your support in keeping them safe.

Parentpay

The daily limit for students to spend is set at £4.50 as a default. This means, should a student select items at break and / or lunch which take them over the limit, they will be asked to put something back. If you would like to change the limit on your child's account please email our catering manager lwarner@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk. Please note: it can take a while before the cashless system updates once you have added funds to your child's catering account. Please be mindful of this and try and get the money on there in plenty of time for break / lunch. When adding funds please ensure you add it to Dinner money and make sure it's not just sitting in your parent account.

Free School Meals

The daily limit for free school meals is £3.30. Funds will need to be added to your child's Parentpay account should you wish them to be allowed to exceed the limit.

Catering Cards

Students must tap their catering card each time they wish to make a purchase, even if they are entitled to free school meals. Please remind them that they need to bring their catering card in every day. Those students without their card will be held back until the end of the queue, allowing those through with cards first. The cards really speed up the catering service, giving students more time to socialise with friends and eat their food. If a card is lost or damaged, a new one can be purchased for £1 on ParentPay. The new card will be delivered to tutors the following morning.

Year 10 & 11 -You will find an item on ParentPay - KS4 Revision Guides & Equipment- just overwrite the amount with the total to be paid, we will check it against your order and let you know when the items can be collected from the shop (or you can call in and collect from main reception if you would prefer).

Helping parents to understand the changes to fines for term time holidays

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued for unauthorised holidays recorded by schools after 19th August 2024.

Who may be fined?

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent who allows their child to be absent from school.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent who allowed the holiday receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for an unauthorised term time holiday the fine amount will be:

£80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Increasing to £160 if paid between days 22-28.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.

These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence, including the U code (late after registers have closed).

For example: a 5 day holiday would meet the national threshold.

The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

Second Offence

(within 3 years)

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

£160 per parent (who allowed the holiday), per child, payable within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and local authorities will need to consider other available measures to address the absence concerns. This may mean that cases are presented before a Magistrate's Court.

Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.

Cases found guilty in the Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.



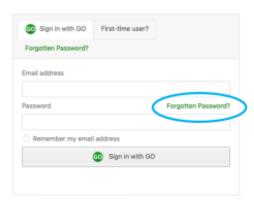



