Year 9 English: Key Skills Assessment (Week After Easter)

The first week back after Easter, all Year 9 students will be sitting a key skill assessment in English. They will be asked to write the opening of a story (which they have studied this half term) and they will complete a SATs-style assessment on unseen texts to test their reading skills. Revision materials are uploaded on Go4Schools.

These assessments are important as they will help us decide on sets for GCSE next year. We will combine this test data with their half-termly assessments, reading ages and baseline data to ensure they are set appropriately. Thus it is important the Year 9s do make a real effort to do their best in these assessments. Any support with revising and motivating students at home would be much appreciated.

Students were asked to think about how their dish may be presented in a restaurant. We all like things to look nice when we eat so wanted the students to start thinking about this this term.

I want to say a massive well done to Eleanor (8Z2) for such impressive dishes this term. She has put such effort in and even thinking about how she would like to present her dishes and has come up with some fantastic ideas. Well done!

Year 9 have been producing a mixture of dishes this term, researching and developing their own pasta dishes with home-made pasta (a new skill learned this term) and thinking about what sauce would complement each pasta shape. It is lovely as always to see them take on these challenges so well. We have also had some classes working on their technical skills (having completed the pasta unit first) including making fine vegetable cuts to improve their knife skills, panna cotta and fruit coulis as well as fish-baps and home-made mushy peas (inspired by Jamie Oliver and an excellent source of Omega 3 oils for brain power!).

We look forward to seeing many of you who have chosen food as an option back here in September to build on these skills! Particular well done to Logan, Emily, Evie and Erin (all in 9D2) Lia in 9A1, Amelia, Alfie and Keegan (all in 9Z1) and Tom in 9D1 for your consistent hard work and effort in practical lessons. Year 10 have been working very hard not only on the theory content of Catering but also on really improving their own practical skills in cooking, ready to begin a mock practical assessment later this year.

They have completed some lovely practical work to develop their skills since Christmas, including: Sectioning a whole chicken and making it into a number of dishes as teams (risotto, marinated chicken with flatbreads and chicken ballotine) Some sweet treats this term have included "Frasier Cakes" (whisked sponge mini gateaux), Fruit Tarts, and a big push on presenting dishes effectively too with a sweet and savoury presentation challenge which has been good fun.



Practical skills are a big part of the mark allocation for their assessments next year so it is great to see them working so hard. We recommend "keeping your eyes peeled" with cooking shows like Masterchef, Great British Menu and even food magazines such as "BBC Good Food" being a great place to get more inspiration and tips to lift your work to a higher level.

Finally huge congratulations to our fantastic Year 11 Hospitality and Catering students! They have put in a lot of hard work and effort completing their NEA. They are now beginning to revise effectively for their written exam in June (worth 40% of the grade). Please don't forget to use the resources on your teams site to help, including past papers and mark schemes. A reminder that CGP workbooks and Revision Guides are very reasonably priced and can be ordered from Parent Pay and are in the Academy shop too. 
Sporting Competitions

We have pleasure of enclosing a link to next weeks <u>menu</u>. Please note that items are subject to change at short notice due to availability of produce from our suppliers. We welcome feedback on our catering offer; so please email our catering manager, Leanne Warner at <u>lwarner@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk</u> with any comments / suggestions.

Nut Allergies

Any form of nut or products that contain nuts should not be brought into school. We do have students with severe nut allergies, which can be life threatening, and we would appreciate your support in keeping them safe.

Parentpay

The daily limit for students to spend is set at £4.50 as a default. This means, should a student select items at break and / or lunch which take them over the limit, they will be asked to put something back. If you would like to change the limit on your child's account please email our catering manager lwarner@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk. Please note: it can take a while before the cashless system updates once you have added funds to your child's catering account. Please be mindful of this and try and get the money on there in plenty of time for break / lunch. When adding funds please ensure you add it to Dinner money and make sure it's not just sitting in your parent account.

Free School Meals

The daily limit for free school meals is £3.30. Funds will need to be added to your child's Parentpay account should you wish them to be allowed to exceed the limit.

Catering Cards

Students must tap their catering card each time they wish to make a purchase, even if they are entitled to free school meals. Please remind them that they need to bring their catering card in every day. Those students without their card will be held back until the end of the queue, allowing those through with cards first. The cards really speed up the catering service, giving students more time to socialise with friends and eat their food. If a card is lost or damaged, a new one can be purchased for £1 on ParentPay. The new card will be delivered to tutors the following morning.

Helping parents to understand the changes to fines for term time holidays

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued for unauthorised holidays recorded by schools after 19th August 2024.

Who may be fined?

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent who allows their child to be absent from school.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent who allowed the holiday receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for an unauthorised term time holiday the fine amount will be:

£80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Increasing to £160 if paid between days 22-28.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.

These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence, including the U code (late after registers have closed).

For example: a 5 day holiday would meet the national threshold.

The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

Second Offence

(within 3 years)

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

£160 per parent (who allowed the holiday), per child, payable within 28 days.


Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and local authorities will need to consider other available measures to address the absence concerns. This may mean that cases are presented before a Magistrate's Court.

Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.

Cases found guilty in the Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.







