

Message from the Principal

It's been another busy though quieter week at Rivers as our Year 12 students have been on their work experience placements which I hope they have enjoyed.

On Tuesday, our Sixth form team hosted a highly successful taster day for 80 students, including many of our current Year 11s and visitors from other schools. The event was a fantastic opportunity to showcase everything our Sixth Form has to offer. It was lovely to see some familiar faces back in the academy and we look forward to welcoming many of these students back next year.

On Thursday, Year 13 students Riley A and Keeaun J represented Rivers at the Ormiston's Got Talent Final, held at the Birmingham Rep Theatre. The talented duo performed an original song they wrote themselves and I have been told that they delivered an outstanding performance. We're incredibly proud of their achievement and congratulate them on reaching the final!

Results Days

A-Level and Level 3 courses. Thursday 14th August. Results will be available to collect from the Sixth Form area between 8 am and 11:30 am. Staff will be ready to speak with students about their next steps and assist with the UCAS clearing process if it is needed.

GCSE and Level 2 courses. Thursday 21st August. Results will be available to collect between 9 am and 11:30 am, please enter the school building via the Foyer doors. Support will be available for careers discussions and our Sixth Form team will be ready for students to confirm their places in Sixth Form for next year.

If students are unable to collect their results in person at the times indicated, they may provide a stamped addressed envelope to main reception before we break up for the summer holiday, results will be posted on the dates indicated above. Alternatively students may nominate an adult to collect results on their behalf. They can do this by confirming by email to <u>Exams@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk</u> <u>using their Ormiston Rivers e-mail address</u> or by providing a signed letter for their nominated adult to bring with them on results day. Results not collected on the day will be available for collection when the school reopens to students on 2nd September.

Certificates will be ready for collection during December 2025, we will confirm the dates that these will be available in students' results packs. In the meantime, please encourage anyone with uncollected certificates from the last two years to collect them before the end of term to make space in our secure store for this summer's certificates when they start to arrive. Former students may request that an alternative adult collects certificates for them by making a request by e-mail to the above address. To avoid delays, please await acknowledgement of the e-mail before coming to collect or bring a printed copy of the email or a letter with you.

We have pleasure of enclosing a link to next weeks <u>menu</u>. Please note that items are subject to change at short notice due to availability of produce from our suppliers. Nut Allergies

Any form of nut or products that contain nuts should not be brought into school. We do have students with severe nut allergies, which can be life threatening, and we would appreciate your support in keeping them safe.

Parentpay

The daily limit for students to spend is set at £4.50 as a default. This means, should a student select items at break and / or lunch which take them over the limit, they will be asked to put something back. If you would like to change the limit on your child's account please email our catering manager lwarner@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk. Please note: it can take a while before the cashless system updates once you have added funds to your child's catering account. Please be mindful of this and try and get the money on there in plenty of time for break / lunch. When adding funds please ensure you add it to Dinner money and make sure it's not just sitting in your parent account.

Free School Meals

The daily limit for free school meals is ± 3.30 . Funds will need to be added to your child's Parentpay account should you wish them to be allowed to exceed the limit.

Catering Cards

Students must tap their catering card each time they wish to make a purchase, even if they are entitled to free school meals. Please remind them that they need to bring their catering card in every day. Those students without their card will be held back until the end of the queue, allowing those through with cards first. The cards really speed up the catering service, giving students more time to socialise with friends and eat their food. If a card is lost or damaged, a new one can be purchased for £1 on ParentPay. The new card will be delivered to tutors the following morning.

All students are required to have sufficient equipment to allow them to learn and achieve their full potential. It is a students' responsibility to arrive at the Academy with the appropriate equipment for lessons:

The Academy Shop, located near the main hall, is open before school 8.30 - 8.50am and at breaktime 11.20 - 11.50am every day. The shop stocks all of the above equipment, as well as a wide selection of revision guides & workbooks, for all year groups. You can also purchase new ties from here. We can only accept cash for shop purchases on site, we are unable to use credit on a students catering card. Alternatively, you can complete an order form and return it to finance@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk.

Year 10 & 11 -You will find an item on ParentPay - KS4 Revision Guides & Equipment- just overwrite the amount with the total to be paid, we will check it against your order and let you know when the items can be collected from the shop (or you can call in and collect from main reception if you would prefer).

Year 7, 8 & 9 (KS3) - Once we have received your completed order, we will add it to your ParentPay account. When payment has been confirmed we will let you know when the items can be collected from the shop (or you can call in and collect from main reception if you would prefer).

Helping parents to understand the changes to fines for term time holidays

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued for unauthorised holidays recorded by schools after 19th August 2024.

Who may be fined?

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent who allows their child to be absent from school.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent who allowed the holiday receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for an unauthorised term time holiday the fine amount will be:

£80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Increasing to £160 if paid between days 22-28.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.

These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence, including the U code (late after registers have closed).

For example: a 5 day holiday would meet the national threshold.

The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

Second Offence

(within 3 years)

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

£160 per parent (who allowed the holiday), per child, payable within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and local authorities will need to consider other available measures to address the absence concerns. This may mean that cases are presented before a Magistrate's Court. Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.

Cases found guilty in the Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

Message from the Safer Essex Roads Partnership regarding the use of e-scooters by children.

Use of privately owned e-scooters in public spaces (roads, cycle tracks, parks etc.) is against the law for anyone, but use by children is leading to serious injuries and children being killed. We want to support you in keeping your children safe.

On the approach to Summer break, those unaware of the law, or the risks to their children, may be considering buying one as a gift. Unfortunately it is not illegal to buy one and the shops and on-line outlets do not make it clear enough that they may only be used on privately owned land.

Please see our e-scooter brochure <u>e-Scooter-A5-leaflet-V3.pdf</u> which explains the legal difference between the trial e-scooters for hire and some of the risks associated with riding.

The key points are that:

1) Privately owned e-scooters (most of which are plain black) are illegal for anyone of any age to ride in any public place. E-scooters you can buy from shops like Halfords and Smyths or online can only be used on privately owned land, with the landowner's permission.

2) Parents providing an e-scooter for their child are putting them at risk on the roads. The children are unlikely to be aware of the Highway Code, are unlikely to wear a helmet or anything to make them visible to other road users, are unlikely to have the observation skills required, are likely to carry a passenger making the scooter unstable and, travelling at speeds of 15mph, are likely to be seriously injured if they fall off or are involved in a collision.
