Teaching Behaviours

At Rivers we are keen to teach our students crucial routines in order to be Ready to Learn. We want to increase the opportunities for students to engage with learning and reduce distractions or opportunities to cause worry.

Our morning routines in form time are the perfect example of this. We line up as year group collectives in Year 7 to 10 to prepare for the day, with Year 11 moving straight to their intervention sessions. Our Form tutors check in with their form groups:

- check that phones are placed into phone pouches
- resolve uniform issues
- check that students have their correct equipment for all lessons

At home parents and carers have a key role in this process too. They will help students to pack their school bags, check on their lesson timetable for the day and ensure that uniform is correct. If there is an issue they can write a note or send an email to the form tutor to ask for support.

We have taught these routines since day one in September and continue to set reminders about these to ensure students are Ready to Learn.

- Jenna S (Year 9) 21st place


A huge well done to all our runners for representing the school so brilliantly and showing such fantastic effort and sportsmanship throughout the day!

There are opportunities for applicants to receive lesser awards and these can be submitted at any time to the trustees on the official David Randall Foundation application form and will be reviewed quarterly by the trustees.

All applications should be supported by a referee, who knows the applicant well and can vouch for their dedication and passion in their chosen field. When applying to the David Randall Foundation you should have read carefully the aims and objectives of the foundation as the trustees will base their decisions on the fulfilment of these criteria.


For a Reader of the Month badge, you need to read one of the recommended books for the month and complete an activity sheet and review.

Health and Social Care and Child Development

Our Year 10 class were tasked to research taking a baby along with pushchair and equipment around Colchester Zoo and checking how accessible this might be for our class assessment. Our group found that some of the pathways were very steep we had our robot baby (Maude Mary), buggy and the changing bag and found this hard to push up the hills. We were lucky that we met Mrs Procter's granddaughter Freya who is 5 months old, and her mum allowed us to push her to see the difference. It was so heavy, two of us had to push Freya. We were also worried we might let go or trip with the pushchair and she would shoot off down the hill. The path was also uneven which again is quite dangerous. The baby changing areas were clean but quite cold inside there were also lots of places we could go if we needed to change our baby. Some parts of the Zoo weren't accessible as the path wasn't suitable for buggies, so we missed that part of the Zoo. We didn't see anywhere for breast-feeding mums could go comfortably to feed their baby. The doorways to enter and exit the Zoo were suitable for a single pushchair but we did see a double buggy that might have had trouble getting in and out of some of the coffee places around the Zoo. We had a brilliant day and saw some lovely animals which would be great for a baby or toddler. ET













Disability Accessibility at the Zoo Year 12 Summary

While exploring the zoo, we observed how well it supported people with Disabilities for our class discussion and recognising if it was giving equal opportunities to this group of people as we have theoretically examined in class for our class assignment.

The paths were not smooth in places they were really bumpy which caused difficulty for one of our groups who has a walking stick. There were ramps but they were steep we didn't come across any lifts which would have been hard to access several parts of the Zoo if you were in a wheelchair. The toilets were accessible and easy to get too although we found there was an alarm going off in one, as far as we could see there was no member of staff attending to the flashing light. Mrs Procter knocked on the door to make sure the individual was okay they said they was and it had been going off when they entered. There wasn't much for individuals with a visual impairment, no braille and coloured floor tape was only visible in some places to see the edges of hills and paths. There were big boards with maps on which were visual but depending on the sight problem not accessible to all. The animals could be seen easily with smaller lower placed windows to see if you were in a wheelchair. There were a couple of trip hazards as one of our students found out as the wood was uneven. We didn't notice any buttons to press to explain what the animal was which would make the experience more inclusive. Thank

you to Miss Welham and Mrs Procter for taking us and bringing the

class experience out in the real world. CB





Foamy Fireworks Light Up the Science Lab

Year 7 lit up the science labs on Wednesday lunchtime with an explosion of colour, bubbles, and excitement during our Foamy Fireworks experiment! Using simple ingredients, washing -up liquid, food colouring, yeast, and a conical flask, students created mini geysers of fizzing foam that shot upwards in spectacular style.

The lab buzzed with gasps, laughter, and plenty of "Look at mine!" as colourful foam erupted across the benches. Behind all the excitement was simple chemistry: yeast breaks down hydrogen peroxide, releasing oxygen that becomes trapped in soapy bubbles. The result? A vibrant foamy eruption worthy of any science celebration.



Nut Allergies

Any form of nut or products that contain nuts should not be brought into school. We do have students with severe nut allergies, which can be life threatening, and we would appreciate your support in keeping them safe.

Parentpay

The daily limit for students to spend is set at £4.50 as a default. This means, should a student select items at break and / or lunch which take them over the limit, they will be asked to put something back. If you would like to change the limit on your child's account please email our catering manager lwarner@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk. Please note: it can take a while before the cashless system updates once you have added funds to your child's catering account. Please be mindful of this and try and get the money on there in plenty of time for break / lunch. When adding funds please ensure you add it to Dinner money and make sure it's not just sitting in your parent account.

Free School Meals

The daily limit for free school meals is £3.30. Funds will need to be added to your child's Parentpay account should you wish them to be allowed to exceed the limit.

Catering Cards

Students must tap their catering card each time they wish to make a purchase, even if they are entitled to free school meals. Please remind them that they need to bring their catering card in every day. Those students without their card will be held back until the end of the queue, allowing those through with cards first. The cards really speed up the catering service, giving students more time to socialise with friends and eat their food. If a card is lost or damaged, a new one can be purchased for £1 on ParentPay. The new card will be delivered to tutors the following morning.

Year 10 & 11 -You will find an item on ParentPay - KS4 Revision Guides & Equipment- just overwrite the amount with the total to be paid, we will check it against your order and let you know when the items can be collected from the shop (or you can call in and collect from main reception if you would prefer).

Year 7, 8 & 9 (KS3) - Once we have received your completed order, we will add it to your ParentPay account. When payment has been confirmed we will let you know when the items can be collected from the shop (or you can call in and collect from main reception if you would prefer).

Helping parents to understand the changes to fines for term time holidays

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued for unauthorised holidays recorded by schools after 19th August 2024.

Who may be fined?

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent who allows their child to be absent from school.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent who allowed the holiday receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for an unauthorised term time holiday the fine amount will be:

£80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Increasing to £160 if paid between days 22-28.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.

These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence, including the U code (late after registers have closed).

For example: a 5 day holiday would meet the national threshold.

The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

Second Offence

(within 3 years)

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

£160 per parent (who allowed the holiday), per child, payable within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and local authorities will need to consider other available measures to address the absence concerns. This may mean that cases are presented before a Magistrate's Court.

Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.

Cases found guilty in the Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.


