

Message from the Principal

Last week, our Year 11 and Year 12 students took part in mock interviews supported by volunteers from our local community and our Governing Body. I would like to extend my sincere thanks to Mrs Compton for organising this valuable experience, and to all the volunteers who kindly gave their time. Their support plays a vital role in helping our students build the confidence and skills they need for their future pathways.

At Rivers, we expect all students to be polite and to follow staff instructions at all times. This week, we have been speaking with students about our expectations around defiance and what this looks like in everyday situations. Defiance includes behaviours such as walking away from a member of staff when asked to stop or discuss an issue, or refusing to follow a reasonable request. Staff will always provide time to take up so students have the chance to meet expectations. When this does not happen, the behaviour will be considered defiance.

To support consistency across the school, staff will be using the “FAIR” shared language when giving instructions:

F – Follow my instructions

A – I am asking you to...

I – It is needed so that...

R – Refusal will mean defiance

Your support in reinforcing these expectations at home is greatly appreciated. Working together helps us maintain a positive, respectful environment where all students and staff can thrive.

We also continue to celebrate students who consistently make positive choices in their attendance and behaviour for learning. Next Friday, before we break up for the half term holiday, we will be holding our third Club Zero Non-Uniform Day. This event recognises all students who have achieved zero negative behaviour points or zero days of absence during this half term. It is always wonderful to see so many students earn their place in Club Zero, and we are incredibly proud of their commitment and hard work.

I am also delighted to share that four of our talented students have made it through to the *Ormiston's Got Talent Regional Final*—a fantastic achievement that reflects their creativity, confidence and dedication. Huge congratulations to **Alissa, Harry, Livvie and Isobelle**. We are incredibly proud of each of them and wish them the very best as they prepare for the final. We look forward to cheering them on.

To widen the understanding and appreciation of the working world, we are delighted to start running the "Take Your Child to Work Day". Your child is invited to participate, and we hope that every student in Year 7-10 will be able to organise a suitable day's experience with a parent, relative, family friend or someone they know well – it does not have to be a parent. Booklets will be handed out in tutor time before half term. Your help is greatly appreciated in helping to organise this for them. We hope a day can be arranged on Monday 23rd February 2026. This is an INSET day, so no lessons will be affected.

The aims of the day are for students to:

- gain an awareness of a workplace organisation
- find out about the jobs that are available in different organisations
- develop an awareness of the skills and qualifications that are required in the workplace
- consider the need to develop an individual learning plan towards employability.

Parents should use their own judgement about where their child goes, and I would like to stress that the focus for students will be observation and fact-finding. Messages from our SENCo, Ms Reynolds

Completion of External Agency Paperwork

Due to the increased demand for external agency paperwork, we have reviewed our administrative procedure for processing the forms.

The request for paperwork from medical professionals for Autism Spectrum Condition and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder exploration is completed by collecting information from teaching and pastoral staff. This considers the feedback from class teachers, safeguarding information, classroom and social time observations from the SEND team, along with the students' academic performance. This process will be completed within 4 weeks, but this is not inclusive of school holidays.



Please be aware, we only complete forms based on the evidence we see in school and therefore, we are unable to amend forms to represent what is seen at home. The forms will be sent directly to the medical professionals, who will decide the next steps for your child. It is important to bear in mind, the exploration of Autism and/or Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder can take up to two years to conclude. The Academy cannot diagnose or have an influence over waiting times.

Referrals for Autism Spectrum Condition / Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder Exploration

The Academy is aware that some parents and guardians have been advised that school must start the referral process for Autism Spectrum Condition and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder exploration. The current NHS guidelines for Essex states that: your child's school, their GP or a health professional can submit a referral via the MyCareBridge online system. A school referral can only be made where there is sufficient evidence, and a history of difficulties seen in the educational setting. In cases where there is insufficient school evidence, a medical professional should decide how best to proceed. We appreciate that this is sometimes difficult for parents and guardians, but self-referral to CAMHs for a behavioural assessment in this case is possible.

Exam Behaviour & JCQ Regulations

As we approach the exam season, it's important to remember the expectations for behaviour during all exams. To ensure a smooth and fair exam experience, students must adhere to the JCQ (Joint Council for Qualifications) regulations, which are in place to maintain integrity and fairness for all candidates.

Key points to remember:

Arrive on time: Make sure you arrive at least 15 minutes before the exam starts. Late arrivals can lead to complications, and in some cases, may not be allowed to sit the exam.

Clear water bottle: Only clear, unlabelled bottles are permitted in the exam room. No labels or logos are allowed on the bottle, and the bottle should be free from any writing or stickers.

Prohibited items: Phones, smartwatches, or any electronic devices must be turned off and left in your bag, which should be placed at the back of the exam room. Only pens, pencils, and necessary equipment should be on your desk.

Respect and Focus: It is essential to maintain a calm, respectful environment for everyone in the exam hall. Please follow the instructions given by the invigilators, remain focused, and take the time to carefully read all instructions. Following these regulations is vital for a smooth exam experience and for your success in the upcoming assessments. Let's all do our part to ensure that everything runs smoothly!

Nut Allergies

Any form of nut or products that contain nuts should not be brought into school. We do have students with severe nut allergies, which can be life threatening, and we would appreciate your support in keeping them safe.

Parentpay

The daily limit for students to spend is set at £4.50 as a default. This means, should a student select items at break and / or lunch which take them over the limit, they will be asked to put something back. If you would like to change the limit on your child's account please email our catering manager lwarner@ormistonriversacademy.co.uk. Please note: it can take a while before the cashless system updates once you have added funds to your child's catering account. Please be mindful of this and try and get the money on there in plenty of time for break / lunch. When adding funds please ensure you add it to Dinner money and make sure it's not just sitting in your parent account.

Free School Meals

The daily limit for free school meals is £3.30. Funds will need to be added to your child's Parentpay account should you wish them to be allowed to exceed the limit.

Catering Cards

Students must tap their catering card each time they wish to make a purchase, even if they are entitled to free school meals. Please remind them that they need to bring their catering card in every day. Those students without their card will be held back until the end of the queue, allowing those through with cards first. The cards really speed up the catering service, giving students more time to socialise with friends and eat their food. If a card is lost or damaged, a new one can be purchased for £1 on ParentPay. The new card will be delivered to tutors the following morning.

Year 7, 8 & 9 (KS3) - Once we have received your completed order, we will add it to your ParentPay account. When payment has been confirmed we will let you know when the items can be collected from the shop (or you can call in and collect from main reception if you would prefer).



Helping parents to understand the changes to fines for term time holidays

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued for unauthorised holidays recorded by schools after 19th August 2024.

Who may be fined?

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent who allows their child to be absent from school.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent who allowed the holiday receiving 3 separate fines.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.

These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence, including the U code (late after registers have closed).

For example: a 5 day holiday would meet the national threshold.

The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for an unauthorised term time holiday the fine amount will be:

£80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Increasing to £160 if paid between days 22-28.

Second Offence

(within 3 years)

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

£160 per parent (who allowed the holiday), per child, payable within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and local authorities will need to consider other available measures to address the absence concerns. This may mean that cases are presented before a Magistrate's Court.

Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.

Cases found guilty in the Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.
